New Vocabulary


Urbanisation – The process of making an area more urban: the development of cities and towns.

Rewilding – The practice of restoring and protecting natural processes and wilderness areas, to increase biodiversity in depleted areas.

Colonialism – A practice or policy of control by one people or power over other people or areas, often by establishing colonies and generally with the aim of economic dominance.

Biodiversity – The variety of life in the world or in a particular habitat or ecosystem. Some of the major causes of biodiversity depletion are land use for agriculture and urban expansion, pollution and changing climate.

Radicalism – The beliefs or actions of people who advocate thorough or complete political or social reform.



Land and Urbanisation


Tensions between the use of land for urbanisation, agriculture or industry and the protection of our environment are getting hotter.
